The B.S. in Economics provides a theoretically consistent paradigm that helps explain why people make the decisions they do. Focusing on theory and quantitative skills, this degree requires a background in both



mathematics and statistics. In terms of real-world applications, the B.S. in Economics covers topics such as strategic pricing behavior by firms, international trade relations, how incentives affect innovative activity, and the relationship between economics and the environment.



Our students develop skills that prepare them for careers in a wide range of contexts: consulting, energy, investing, transportation, healthcare, entrepreneurship, and more. Our B.S. in Economics also provides a strong platform for pu

pursuing advanced degrees in the social sciences or in the professional schools of law, management, or public administration.



B.S. Economics and International Affairs

In this specialized joint degree, students take a variety of coursework in the School of Economics and the Sam Nunn School of International Affairs. The EIA program focuses on the most pressing concerns of today's global community as Economics provides the framework for rigorous and systematic analysis of challenges and opportunities framed by International Affairs in the context of globalization and international economics.

This degree provides specific training in international security and diplomacy, comparative cultures, statistical modeling, and microeconomic and macroeconomic theory and policy. Select topics include how international conflict is motivated by economic considerations, the economic consequences of foreign policy, and how changes in exchange rates impact the global community.

Internships

Students in the School of Economics are encouraged to participate in at least one internship during their time at Georgia Tech, but many students complete two or even three. Internships provide students with a practical setting where they can gain real-world experience while directly applying the knowledge acquired in the classroom. Internships can be paid or taken for course credit.

B.S. Global Economics and Modern Languages

In partnership with the School of Modern Languages, the School of Economics offers this specialized joint degree with language concentrations in Chinese, Japanese, German, French or Spanish.

Through a variety of courses and the opportunity to spend a semester abroad, students gain an in-depth knowledge of other cultures and the ability to successfully navigate the challenges and opportunities by the global, presented economically interdependent, multilingual, and multicultural environment. The coursework focuses on rigorous training in economics combined extensive foreign language study leading to advanced communication skills and professional competency in the language of choice.
